

## The Estates General of 1789



Little used assembly of delegates that advise the king when called...

Delegates represented each of the three estates

#### But First.....

#### The Estates General of 1789

Advisory body, no true power Presents petitions from the estates...usually about economic issues


Last met in 1614

#### Traditionally

Equal # of representatives from each estate

3<sup>rd</sup> Estate demands and gets double # of representatives

#### The Estates General of 1789

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
#### Traditionally

Equal # of representatives from each estate Vote by order: Each estate (no matter the # of reps) gets one vote

3<sup>rd</sup> Estate demands and gets double # of representatives


#### Makeup of the Estates General

#### Historical Voting Pattern: Voting by Estates

Louis XIV insisted that the ancient distinction of the three orders be conserved in its entirety including the voting patterns

## **Events Escalate**

3<sup>rd</sup> Estate wants everyone to meet together –
 1Man = 1 Vote

 3<sup>rd</sup> Estate separates from EG and forms the <u>National Assembly</u> – this is usually thought of as the beginning of the French Revolution


Tennis Court Oath: delegates of 3rd Estate gather and demand a constitution!


Declare themselves the National Convention

- The fall of the Bastille (July 14, 1789)
- Sans-culottes: poor urban workers








A British view of sansculottes

## **Notable Achievements**

- Declaration of the Rights of Man and of the Citizen
- Constitution of 1791 creates a constitutional monarchy
